Rules Corner

Before we get to today's subject, it has been pointed out to me that I forgot one possible additional option if your ball is hit into a Penalty Area.

In connection with some, but not all Penalty Areas, there may be a Drop Area, which is usually designated with a wooden pole labeled "Drop Area". Sometimes these areas are even on the putting green side of a Penalty Area, such as on Holes #2, #10 and #17. If you would prefer to hit from the Drop Area rather than taking other relief options, you may drop your ball in that area.

Ok. Today's subjects are Balls Lost or Out of Bounds.

Balls Lost or Out of Bounds

If your ball is lost *outside a Penalty Area* or comes to rest Out of Bounds:

- 1. Your ball is lost if not found within three minutes of when you begin to search for it
 - a. You must re-tee the ball if hit from the teeing area or drop a ball where the previous stroke was

made if not hit from the teeing area.

b. Once you hit again from that area, your original ball is no longer in play. This is true even if your original ball is found on the course before the end of the three-minute search time.

- 2. Your ball is out of bounds only if all of the ball has crossed the out of bounds line.
- **a**. You must re-tee the ball if hit from the teeing area or drop a ball where the previous stroke was made if not hit from the teeing area.
- 3. As noted above, the Club has instituted a Local Rule that would allow you to place your ball within two club lengths of the edge of the fairway, in the fairway, straight across from where the ball crossed the out



of bounds line or from where it is deemed to have been lost. If the original shot was your drive, you would be hitting 4 from where you drop the ball.

- **4**. If your ball might be lost outside a Penalty Area or be Out of Bounds, to save time, you may play a provisional ball from the teeing area, now hitting 3 (assuming your provisional ball becomes your ball in play.
 - **a**. If it is *known* or *virtually certain* that the ball is lost in a

Penalty Area, a provisional ball is not allowed.

- b. If you are going to play a provisional ball, you need to announce such before hitting the ball.
- **c**. The provisional ball becomes the ball in play, whether or not the original ball is found, if it is hit from a location nearer to the hole than where the original ball is found.
- **5**. You will generally decide whether to choose option 3. or 4. above based on how well you hit your drive. If you didn't hit your drive very far, you might choose option 4. But, if you hit your drive a long distance, you might choose option 3.
