The Club at Apple Mountain Multiple Tee Handicap Determination

The USGA Handicap Manual takes into consideration that different tees usually have different ratings. "Since a USGA Course Rating reflects the probable scores of a scratch golfer, the higher-rated course is more difficult, and the player playing from the set of tees with the higher USGA Course Rating receives additional stroke(s) equal to the difference between each USGA Course Rating, with the resulting figure rounded off to the nearest whole number."

For ease of computation and understanding among the players, the White/Gold Combination tee rating is normally used as the base, with those players playing to their published handicaps from those tees. Players from other tees will have their handicaps from their respective tees being adjusted by the difference in rating between those tees and the rating for the White/Gold Combination tees.

When practical, it is most desirable to wheel off the tees used by the most players in a flight. Handicaps for those playing from other tees would have their handicaps increased or decreased in accordance with the procedure set forth above.
